In order to receive full credit, you must have ALL of the following on the project due date:

- Rubric - self-graded in pencil
- Peer Edit - with tallies & comments
- Project Review - with tallies, checks, comments
- Rough Draft - with peer editing
- Second Draft - with self-editing
- Final Draft - with evidence of changes made following edits
- Project

Grading criteria:

- ✓ Vocabulary & grammar from current Etapa
- ✓ Vocabulary & grammar from previous Etapas
- ✓ Conventions - spelling, punctuation, accents, agreement, etc.
- ✓ Pronunciation
- ✓ Delivery - well-rehearsed; lines delivered with little or no visible evidence of script
- ✓ Organization
- ✓ Creativity of concept & execution - (for scripts - use of props, costumes, variety of settings)
- ✓ Effort - evidence that a considerable amount of time went into the preparation of the project

****Be sure to use as much Spanish as possible in your project including all words in titles of posters, PowerPoints, web pages, and videos.****

Taking credit for your work & giving credit to others...

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

Intellectual property refers to creations of the mind: inventions, literary and artistic works, and symbols, names, and images used in commerce. The people who originate these creations are property owners - that includes YOU!

COPYRIGHT:

Copyright includes literary works such as novels, poems and plays, films, musical works such as sheet **music** and recorded performances, artistic works such as drawings, paintings, **photographs** and sculptures, and architectural designs.

All information is assumed to be copyrighted even if does not display the copyright symbol. To use information created by someone else requires permission either granted by courtesy or purchased. However, students and teachers are granted "fair use" of copyrighted information.

FAIR USE:

For the purpose of instruction and educational presentation, students and teachers may use the following amounts of copyrighted material without specific permission:

- Text: 10% or 1,000 words, whichever is less, of a copyrighted work
- Music: 10%, but no more than 30 seconds of music & lyrics from an individual song
- Video: 10% or 3 minutes, whichever is less
- Images: no more than 5 images by the same artist or photographer

Their products may not be posted on the Internet or distributed in any other way.
